





Dr. Ir. BAMBANG SUSANTONO

MCP, MSCE, PhD Chairman, Nusantara National Capital Authority, Republic of Indonesia

Bambang Susantono is the Chairman of the Nusantara National Capital Authority of the Republic of Indonesia. He was inaugurated by Indonesian President H.E. Joko Widodo in March 2022. The Authority, a ministerial-level agency working directly under the President, is in charge of planning and constructing Indonesia's new capital.

Prior to this appointment, Mr. Susantono was the Vice-President for Knowledge Management and Sustainable Development of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) between 2015-2022. He was responsible for managing ADB's Sustainable Development and Climate Change Department, Economic Research and Regional Cooperation Department, and External Relations Department.

Before ADB, Mr. Susantono was Indonesia's Vice Minister of Transportation and, prior to that, Deputy Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development at the Coordinating Ministry of Economic Affairs. He chaired several research institutes, taught in universities, and previously commissioner for some airline, port, telco, and media companies.

Among other activities in international organizations, Mr. Susantono currently serves as a member in United Nations' High-Level Experts and Leaders' Panel on Waters and Disasters, Islamic Development Bank Institute's Board of Trustees, Bloomberg New Economy Council for Cities, and Tech for Good Institute's Advisory Board.

He has published numerous books and papers on urban planning and transportation, both in English and Indonesian. "Creating Liveable Asian Cities" and "Informal Services in Asian Cities" are among his books published by Asian Development Bank. His papers also published in reputable journals, with title such as "Accelerating National Competitiveness Through Economic Corridor Development: Indonesia Masterplan Revisited", "On Hedging Properties of Infrastructure Assets During the Pandemic: What We Learn from Global and Emerging Markets?", and "Urban Water Future: What Can We Learn from the Singapore Experience?".

Mr. Susantono holds a PhD in Infrastructure Planning and master's degrees in Transportation Engineering, and City and Regional Planning from the University of California Berkeley. He holds a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from the Institute of Technology, Bandung.

JAMES TUMA Group Director, Futura State, URBIS

James is a visionary urban designer with a broad skills palette; and the leader of Urbis' strategic advisory arm: Future State. Future State leverages Urbis and Cistri's evidence-base and combines it with creative problem solving to help government and the private sector create better cities.

Since joining Urbis in 2005, he has worked on significant national and international projects in Australia, Asia and Europe including the structuring and conceptualisation of new towns, urban renewal and revitalisation strategies for major capital cities, university campuses, major tourism precincts, and significant infrastructure projects.

James is an advocate for sustainable and inclusive cities and focuses on imaginative solutions to the most complex urban challenges of our time. He has made outstanding contributions in leading the two most recent master plans for Brisbane City Centre, is the lead designer for the internationally significant Queen's Wharf redevelopment and advised on the redevelopment and governance of Orchard Road in Singapore. He also contributes to improving our cities in his role as Adjunct Professor of Design at Queensland University of Technology and is currently the lead advisor for the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games Legacy strategy and plan.

From July 2023 as the newly appointed Managing Partner, James is motivated to cement Urbis and Cistri as the leading voice on cities.

She led a team to organize the Ninth Session of World Urban Forum for UN-Habitat and the Malaysian Government, formulate the Low Carbon Cities Assessment Framework for the Ministry of Energy, Green Technology and Water and formulated the Malaysia SDG Cities Roadmap. She is now the Director for Malaysian Institute of Planner's Low Carbon Cities and Sustainability Centre, a Fellow with Institute Masa and is a member of the Leadership Council for Sustainable Development Solutions Network Malaysia, where her passion lies in promoting the sustainable agenda to providing innovative solutions that contribute towards better quality of life and Malaysia's built environment.
